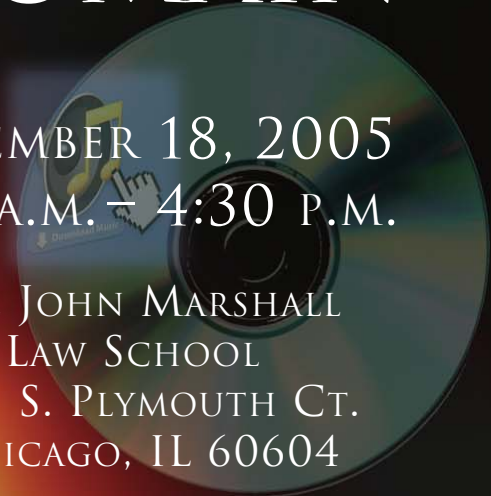

# CREATIVE PROCESSES AND THE PUBLIC DOMAIN

November 18, 2005  
9:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

This conference is designed to bring together top scholars from intellectual property law, art and psychology to explore the nature of the creative process and the impact of the public domain on this process. While encouraging creativity has purportedly been a goal of copyright protection, and other legal regimes used to define the boundaries between the public domain and a creator's work, the precise nature of this relationship appears to have undergone a profound change in the later decades of the 20th century. This conference will explore the nature of that relationship, including newly emerging theories regarding public domain analysis, and any necessary reforms to current domestic and global copyright systems to assure that the processes of creativity continue to flow.
